OYSTER CREEK, Texas — Oyster Creek Community Volunteer Fire Department received a \$50,000 grant to purchase a small truck chassis. This grant was made possible through the Rural Volunteer Fire Department Assistance Program.

The truck will be used primarily as a brush truck to improve the department's capabilities during grass fires.

The truck will also be used to pull the department's side by side and trailers used during emergencies.
